In English this week, we continued to read our book 'The Iron Man'. We considered how to write complex sentences using a range of conjunctions and adverb starters. Exploring setting descriptions and applying our learning on conjunctions and adverbs, we then created our own based on The Iron Man. During maths this week we have been multiplying, adding and subtracting measures including money. Year 4's have also been working on decimals and understanding place value up to two decimal places. We have been learning all about magnets in this weeks science lesson. Children have worked together to measure the force of an object across different surfaces recording their findings in a variety of ways..

In art the children have been applying the shading techniques they have been practicing and have completed their sketches of the Iron Man which will now been used for our class display.

This week in RE, we looked more in depth at the events of Palm Sunday and discovered the impact these events have on our lives today. To show our understanding we wrote our own prayers for Palm Sunday.

Next week: In maths, next week, we will be looking at properties of 2D shapes and 3D shapes. During English we will look at the features of newspaper reports in order to write our own about the amazing events in 'The Iron Man.' Science will see us continuing to explore forces with an introduction to magnets and in RE we will continue to study the events of Holy Week.
