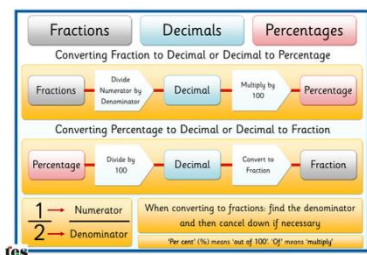

Adverbials - to show time, place, frequency, manner and degree of possibility

An adverbial is a word or phrase that is used, like an adverb, to modify a verb or clause. Adverbials can be used as adverbials, but many other types of words and phrases can be used this way, including prepositional phrases and subordinate clauses. They can be used in different places within a sentence to create different effects. When they are used at the beginning of sentences, they are often called **fronted adverbials**.
